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MCHD Financial Report – Sean Flaherty Scty/Treas	MCHD Scty/Treas Sean Flaherty reviewed the enclosed bank statements. Received sales and use tax deposits for August are sales tax \$186,366.40 and mill levy of \$12,567.47. The transaction list was distributed. Mr. Flaherty did make a call to the Mozer Financial Advisor and there is currently \$800,000 in the investment account and he suggests moving it to a market mutual fund, this would increase the find by \$26k (estimated) a year and MCHD could possibly add more once the move has been completed. MCHD is required to complete and submit an certified audit to the State of Colorado and has not done so for 2024 and 2025. Mr. Flaherty wanted a note to be made to keep an eye on this for future purposes and if accounting services are changed. This delay could impose MCHD in a delay of collecting sales tax next month.
